I thought I would share this story that was recently published in the Great Lakes Pilot newspaper.

A man and wife cooking team on a steamer decided to quit sailing and bought the dry Dock Tavern in River Rouge. An old man hung around there wearing a heavy winter overcoat year 'round. The cook told him he'd fix up a cot for him in the basement. He installed a shower and toilet, cook-stove and refrigerator and told him "You can stay down here rent-free if you clean and mop the tavern after closing time." During the day he would eat upstairs with them. He never took his heavy overcoat off. This went on for about five years, and he died leaving no relatives. He left everything to the cook and his wife. His overcoat was lined with thousands of dollars. He had four or five apartment houses and a great deal of stock. All told, he left about \$850,000; no one thought he was worth a dime! The cook closed the tavern, bought a large van and traveled around the country for about a year. He became tired of that and returned to Detroit and opened his tavern again.
